


CORE VALUES



CORE VALUES

- 1. **Child Centric** Almost all our decisions are made by keeping children at the center and the rules and norms created in the organization are done so with the child at the center.
- 2. **Culture of ownership** Team members are given opportunities to work on their own ideas and value is placed upon their opinions/perspectives.
- 3. **Push boundaries (personal + organizational)** Team members work beyond the call of their duty and we as an organization work towards responding to the need of the children/community it is working in rather than sticking to a set goal since the beginning of the operations.
- 4. **Strong work ethic** Importance is placed on punctuality in deliverables, both in words and action and on responsive and responsible communication along with appreciation of the same.
- 5. **Solution oriented** We aim at creating space for the team to implement proposed solutions and show tolerance to failure of the same, thus using experiential learning for the growth of our team along with our children.

My journey with Project KHEL started way back in 2013, while I was at a shelter home. At that time some 'didi' and 'bhaiya' would come to Gharonda to play with us I did not like playing with them much. Slowly I began gaining interest in their sessions but only on the days that some super energetic activity was scheduled. It was only eventually that I realized that while playing I was learning as well, things like team work, problem solving, how to behave with others and so on. As I began responding to the programme along with our peers, we were constantly being challenged, that encouraged us to try different activities, build a stronger sense of trust among ourselves, solve problems together and also develop empathy for people different than us, gain gender sensitivity, understand the many aspects of child labor and much more. I had began valuing the discussions we had during these sessions, which led me to get interested in facilitating these sessions too.

After a couple of opportunities to represent Project KHEL at different occasions, I finally joined as a youth leader in the second half of 2016. My journey since then has been slow but steady. On my first day I got stuck in multiple situations, most often just not being able to communicate to the children what I had in mind. As I began being scheduled for more and more sessions, I began growing both as a facilitator and a person. I did often find myself in a situation where handling children barely a couple of years younger than me problematic, but didi bhaiya were always supportive and encouraging. I was given the space to make mistakes and experiment what worked for me and not merely copy what my seniors were doing in their sessions.


As I turned 18, continued to perform better, became more confident in leading my sessions nad giving feedback constructively to my colleagues, most of who are older than me, I was offered to join as a full-time team member while continuing my studies in a long-distance format. I am now being given newer




responsibilities, am learning about all the hard work that goes into planning a session, beginning from pre-planning for sessions, time management within a session and more importantly I am learning to be responsible for myself and become a professional. At Project KHEL, everyone is considered an equal without any discrimination. I feel free to try and learn new things and bhaiya and didi are there to correct me. Currently, I am learning to use Photoshop and all of Microsoft Office tools, while studying in class 12 and also doing sessions and the additional work given to me at work. In the near future, I want to establish my own business and I am hopeful that all my learning from Project KHEL, before, during and after sessions will help me thrive. - Santosh Kumar, Facilitator



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


